The FCPA and the UK Bribery Bill criminalise certain acts of overseas bribery anywhere in the world if carried out by US and UK companies. Despite these risks to companies, company directors, and company individuals, many US and UK companies have not put in place procedures to manage these risks.

- the key elements of bribery offences under US and UK legislation;
